\*\*\*Upper division GE taken for a letter grade will double count in the support column.

This flowchart assumes you entered Cal Poly with 90 baccalaureate-level quarter units completed and with GE certification. It represents one example of a two-year plan, not the only path to graduation in two years. Major courses, GE, and Electives can be alternated depending on each particular student's needs.
